B. REVIEW TPF PROJECT RANKINGS

Mr. Denton said these are not ranked in the MTP. Could you please explain that.

Ms. Yngve said the first two are traffic operations. We don't have traffic operations or maintenance options in the MTP.

Ms. Kruegar said the transportation fund is set up to help local communities so, they don't necessarily have to be regionally significant. They don't need to be in the Transportation Plan.

Chair Glorioso-Moss said we decided to pull out the Henry Lynch Road costs.

Mr. Trujillo thanked Ms. Yngve for her presentation and he said the County is willing to partner with the City on Henry Lynch.

Ms. Yngve said this is the final product for the potential trail loop on the southside of Santa Fe.

Ms. Yngve reviewed the publication and process

Mr. Alvarado said this is very creative.

Mr. Denton said this is "really cool." What happens if we adopt this.

Ms. Yngve said it strengthens funding opportunities.

F. FORMAL RECOGNITION OF CITY BEING THE PROJECT LEAD ON HENRY LYNCH/AGUA FRIA ROUNDABOUT PROJECT - DESIGN FUNDING VIA ROMELLA/NMDOT LOCAL ROAD FUND

Ms. Yngve said this is related to the City work on redesigning Henry Lynch and that part of that road which is on County land. This is to have on record a formal agreement for agency partnerships, including seeking funds.

Chair Glorioso-Miss said the City has approved funding for the design of the roundabout. We have an MOU with the County for the design of the road. We are leading the design. We thought it would be beneficial if the roundabout was designed at the same time as the road was designed. We are hoping for design money from the Local Governments Design Fund. We can use Road Impact Fee funds as well. We met three weeks ago and everyone is supportive of the funding opportunities.

Mr. Trujillo asked if it in final design.

Chair Glorioso-Moss said Henry Lynch is in the final design. There is a separate contract for the roundabout.

MPO SELF-CERTIFICATION

Amendment 7 to the FFY 2022-2027 TIP Approved on May 25th, 2023 by the Santa Fe MPO Transportation Policy Board

In accordance with 23 U.S.C. 450.334, the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT), and the Santa Fe Metropolitan Planning Organization (SFMPO) for the Santa Fe urbanized area hereby certify that the transportation planning process, specifically Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment 5 meets the Performance-Based Planning and Programming (PBPP) requirements established in 23 CFR 450.326(d), 49 CFR 625, and 49 CFR 630. The projects selected in the FFY 2022 – 2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) were developed from the priorities outlined in the NMDOT Asset Management Plan, the New Mexico Strategic Highway Safety Plan, and the New Mexico Freight Plan; and from the priorities outlined in the Santa Fe Trails Transit Asset Management Plan, and the Santa Fe MPO 2020-2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan and its formally adopted Master Plans.

The programmed projects included in this Amendment 7 to the TIP support the adopted Performance Targets of the Santa Fe MPO for Performance Measure 1 (Safety), Performance Measure 2 (State of Good Repair), Performance Measure 3 (System Performance), and Transit Asset Management. The TIP and each formal amendment were developed, reviewed and processed by the Santa Fe MPO in accordance with the Santa Fe MPO Public Participation Plan and the Santa Fe MPO Title VI Plan. The Santa Fe MPO also certifies that the transportation planning process is addressing the major issues in the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable requirements of:

- (1) The fiscal constraint required in 23 C.F.R. 450;
- (2) 49 U.S.C. 5323(1), 23 U.S.C. 135, and 23 U.S.C. 450.220;
- (3) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Title VI assurance executed by each State under 23 U.S.C. 324 and 29 U.S.C. 794;
- (4) Section 1101(b) of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (Pub. L. 105-178) regarding the involvement of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in FHWA and FTA funded planning projects (Sec. 105(f), Pub. L. 97-424, 96 Stat. 2100; 49 CFR, Subtitle A, Part 26);
- (5) The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Pub. L. 101-336, 104 Stat. 327, as amended) and U. S. DOT implementing regulation;
- (6) The provision of 49 U.S.C. Part 20 regarding restrictions on influencing certain activities; and
- (7) Sections 174 and 176(c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506(c) and (d)).
